



This report was prepared according to the provisions of §1545, Louisiana Revised Statutes to provide statistics on first-time test takers of the 1401 LA Life Insurance Exam for Calendar Year 2014

## **OVERVIEW**

For the purpose of aiding the Louisiana Department of Insurance in ensuring that the Louisiana Life Insurance Exam is fair and of high quality, this report was prepared according to the provisions of **§1545**, Louisiana Revised Statutes, and will be published annually using data from the contracted testing vendor.

## §1545. Examination

- I. (1) The commissioner of insurance shall prepare, publicly announce, and publish a report that summarizes statistical information relating to life insurance agent examinations administered during the preceding calendar year. Each report shall include the following information for all examinees combined and separately by gender, race or ethnicity, race or ethnicity within gender, education level, and native language:
  - (a) The total number of examinees.
  - (b) The percentage and number of examinees who passed the examination.
  - (c) Standard deviation of scaled scores on the examination.
  - (2) The commissioner of insurance shall prepare and make available upon request a report of summary statistical information relating to each life insurance test form administered during the preceding calendar year. The report shall show, for each test form, for all examinees combined and separately for African–American examinees, American Indian examinees, Hispanic examinees, white examinees, and other examinees, the correct-answer rate and correlations.
  - (3) The reports referred to in Paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Subsection shall be published no later than May first of the current year.

## **SCOPE OF WORK**

This report provides summary statistics by demographic categories of first-time candidates taking the LA Life Insurance Exam during the period of January 1, 2014 through December 31, 2014. The report also includes summary scaled score statistics by candidate demographic categories for the LA Life Insurance Exam administered from January 1, 2014 through December 31, 2014.

Candidate demographic information was voluntarily self-reported through a survey administered by the testing vendor, Prometric, at the time the candidates took the exams. The exams were administered using an IRT LOFT model that creates a unique form for each candidate that is equivalent in content and difficulty to all the other candidates' forms in that administration year.

Performance data from first-time test takers is generally more stable, so data from repeat test takers is not included in this report.
